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SECTION 1: SUMMARY OF CHANGES

Preface

This edition of the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Survey manual contains UCR specifications for all legislation released prior to **January 1st, 2023**. Please see subsection 1.1 ‘Legislative Changes’ for a detailed description of new legislation which have occurred since the release of the previous version of the manual in June 2022.

1.1 Legislative and Other Changes

There are two types of changes that affect the UCR survey: changes brought in by the Government of Canada in the form of a new bill or law and changes that are initiated by the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS), most often as a result of feedback or requests from police services.

Bills that are introduced by the Government of Canada, and which subsequently become law, restrict what the CCJCSS can and cannot do. The new laws must be implemented, on the date they come into force, by all police services and records management software companies. This normally means new data entry rules and possibly a series of new UCR survey codes.

The second type of changes are those initiated by the CCJCSS, often at the request of police services. These are changes aimed at simplifying or clarifying scoring rules, making reporting more uniform, or making the UCR reflect more closely what police services capture. These changes should be made whenever possible, either through updates, a patch, or an upgraded version of the software or by manually adding to the concordance tables.

List of recent changes to the survey

Animal Cruelty

Due to an increased need for data related to animal cruelty, the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS) has broken out UCR violation code 3810 (Wilful/Forbidden acts in respect of property) in order to include more detailed violations in the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Survey. As a result, violation code 3810 ‘Wilful and Forbidden Acts in Respect of Certain Property (Part XI CC)’ has been expired and the following six violations have been added to the survey: 3811 ‘Other Interference with Property’, 3812 ‘Injuring or endangering Animals’, 3813 ‘Killing or injuring Law Enforcement or Military Animals’, 3814 ‘Causing unnecessary suffering to Animals’, 3815 ‘Causing damage or injury due to a failure to exercise reasonable care - animals or birds’, and 3816 ‘Arena for animal fighting’.

Effective July 1st 2022, six violation codes have been added to the UCR survey.

Offences Against the Person and Reputation

In response to suggestions and commentary from police services, the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS) has broken out UCR violation code 3770 (Other Offences Against the Person and Rep) in order to establish Failure to Provide Necessaries and Impeding Attempt to Save Life as violent (1000 series) violations. As a result, violation code 3770 Other Offences Against the Person and Rep (Part VIII CC) has been expired and the following three violations have been added to the survey: 1639 Failure to Provide Necessaries, 1640 Impeding Attempt to Save Life, and 3772 Other Offences Against the Person and Reputation.

Effective October 1st 2022, three violation codes have been added to the UCR survey.

Bill S-223: An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (Trafficking in Human Organs)

The Canadian Government granted royal assent to *Bill S-223: An Act to amend the Criminal Code and the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act (Trafficking in Human Organs)*, on December 15, 2022. In response to the changes outlined in this new legislation, the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS) has made adjustments to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Survey. The enactment of Bill S-223 amends the *Criminal Code* to create new offences in relation to trafficking in human organs, among other changes.

Effective **December 15, 2022**, sections 240.1(1) Removal without informed consent and 240.1(2) Financial transaction became punishable offences under the *Criminal Code*. As a result, the following violation code has been added to the UCR Survey:

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Punishment

240.1(3) Everyone who commits an offence under subsection (1) or (2) is guilty of an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than 14 years.



Gender Code Updates

In order to align with the Canadian 2021 Census, the Canadian Centre for Justice and Community Safety Statistics (CCJCSS) is modifying existing gender code labels in the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Survey. Option labels within the variables victim gender and charged/suspect chargeable gender will be modified accordingly; F – Female will change to F – Woman, M – Male will change to M - Man and D - Gender Diverse will be changed to D - Non-binary. Please note that there is no change to the codes used (F, M and D) these are changes to the label associated with each code only.

Below are the adjustments as they will appear in the next version of the UCR manual:

Gender		
F	Woman	Persons who publicly express as women in their daily lives, including at work, while shopping or accessing other services, in their housing environment or in the broader community.
M	Man	Persons who publicly express as man in their daily lives, including at work, while shopping or accessing other services, in their housing environment or in the broader community.
D	Non-Binary	Persons who publicly expresses as neither exclusively man nor exclusively woman. It includes persons who are unsure of their gender, persons who express themselves as both man and woman or neither man nor woman, including at work, while shopping or accessing other services, in their housing environment or in the broader community.

CCJCSS is ready to accept these new changes and police services should begin using it as soon as their RMS allows it.



SECTION 2: INTRODUCTION

2.1 Information for Respondents

Authority

Statistics Act, Revised Statutes of Canada, 1985, Chapter S19

Objectives

This survey collects essential incident-based data on the nature and extent of crime in Canada. It provides comprehensive data for more complete crime analysis, resource planning, and program development for the policing community. Municipal and Provincial governments use these data to aid decisions about the distribution of police resources, definitions of provincial standards, and for comparisons with other departments and provinces. To the Federal government it provides information for policy and legislative development, evaluation of new legislative initiatives and international comparisons. As well, media, academics, and researchers use these data to examine questions about crime.

Confidentiality

Statistics Canada is prohibited by law from publishing any statistics which would divulge information obtained from this survey that relates to any identifiable respondent/individual without the previous written consent of the respondent/individual. The information reported will be treated in confidence, used for statistical purposes, and published in aggregate form only. The confidentiality provisions of the *Statistics Act* are not affected by either the *Access to Information Act* or any other legislation.

SECTION 3: GENERAL RULES OF UCR SCORING

In order to collect data and produce crime statistics which may be compared across Canada, the rules of the UCR survey must be applied uniformly. The purpose of this section of the manual is to provide information regarding the key concepts, general rules and terminology used by the UCR survey.

3.1 UCR Terminology

Violation

Refers to a contravention of the *Criminal Code* or other Federal or Provincial Statute.

UCR Incident

An incident for the purposes of the UCR survey is considered to be the set of connected events which usually constitute an occurrence report and may contain one or more violations of the law (and their related victims and charged/suspect – chargeable records). These may be grouped into the same unique incident if and only if they are committed by the same person or groups of persons and if they occur at the same time and place. There are some exceptions to this rule. Please see the section on *continuing offence rule* for more information.

An incident can contain one to four violation codes. The most serious violation, as determined by the maximum penalty, is referred to as Most Serious Violation (MSV) within an incident. When reporting, the MSV must always be the first violation code listed on the record. Your records management system may be programmed to do this automatically.

Victim

The term victim is a central concept in UCR scoring. For the purpose of reporting incidents, a *victim* is a person who is the target of a violent or aggressive action (or threat) and should not be confused with a complainant who is the target of a non-violent incident. A violent violation of the law generally involves the use of aggressive action (with the intent to do harm) or the credible threat of such action by one person against another. The survey also collects victims of criminal traffic violations. For this, the victim is the target of an intended/unintended violent action.

People who have been victimized as a result of lost property, either through damage or theft, are defined as complainants rather than victims.

Charged/Suspect - Chargeable

A Charged/Suspect – Chargeable (CSC) is a person who has been identified as an accused person in an incident and against whom a charge may be laid in connection with that incident.

Place

A *place* as defined by the UCR is a single connected property that is owned, rented, or occupied by the same person (or group of people), **e.g.**, a residence or a business. In the case of property crimes the place is extended to include motor vehicles.

Motor vehicles are defined as:



A vehicle which is propelled or driven other than by muscular power, but does not include a vehicle which operates on rails.

The concept of place applies only to non-traffic violations.

Below are the categories of motor vehicles which are defined as a single place:

Automobiles - includes all models of automobiles and station wagons.

Trucks - includes all models of trucks and buses designed to transport people or freight, including vans and motor homes.

Motorcycles - includes all types of motorcycles with two or three wheels such as motorized bicycles, or motor scooters.

Other Motor Vehicle - includes motorized snow vehicles, farm tractors, commercial-use lawn mowers, and other self-propelled farming implements, cranes, fork-lifts, graders, bulldozers and other self-propelled vehicles (designed and used on construction sites, building, and maintenance of roads and in the lumber industry), army tanks, army jeeps, all-terrain vehicles, and golf carts.

The vehicle's registration is not a criterion for determining whether a particular vehicle is a motor vehicle or not. The following are not considered motor vehicles under the UCR definition of "place":

- aircraft
- boats
- vessels of all types
- hovercrafts
- power wheelchairs, and
- non-commercial type snow blowers.

Place – Examples:

A single home, the attached or detached garage, the backyard and driveway, the backyard shed, which are all located on the same contiguous property and that belong (or are rented by) the same person.

Two apartments in the same building are separate places if they are rented or occupied by different people.

The city home and the cottage, owned by the same person, are separate places because they are not connected.

Two cars are considered separate places for UCR survey purposes, except when multiple motor vehicle thefts occur at one the same location at the same time. This can be recorded on one incident record, using the counter to indicate the number of motor vehicle thefts that occurred.

Three business offices in the same building that have no business connections to each other are considered three different places.

Definition of Peace Officer

(a) A mayor, warden, reeve, sheriff, deputy sheriff, sheriff's officer, and justice of the peace,



- (b) A member of the Correctional Service of Canada who is designated as a peace officer pursuant to Part I of the *Corrections and Conditional Release Act*, and a warden, deputy warden, instructor, keeper, jailer, guard, and any other officer or permanent employee of a prison other than a penitentiary as defined in Part I of the *Corrections and Conditional Release Act*,
- (c) A police officer, police constable, bailiff, constable, or other person employed for the preservation and maintenance of the public peace or for the service or execution of civil process,
- (d) An officer within the meaning of the *Customs Act*, the *Excise Act 2001*, or a person having the powers of such an officer, when performing any duty in the administration of any of those Acts,
- (e) An officer authorized under subsection 138(1) of the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*,
- (f) A person designated as a fishery guardian under the *Fisheries Act* when performing any duties or functions under that Act and a person designated as a fishery officer under the *Fisheries Act* when performing any duties or functions under that Act or the *Coastal Fisheries Protection Act*,
- (g) The pilot in command of an aircraft (while the aircraft is in flight),
 - (i) Registered in Canada under regulations made under the *Aeronautics Act*, or
 - (ii) Leased without crew and operated by a person who is qualified under regulations made under the *Aeronautics Act* to be registered as owner of an aircraft registered in Canada under those regulations, while the aircraft is in flight, and
- (h) Officers and non-commissioned members of the Canadian Forces who are;
 - (i) Appointed for the purposes of section 156 of the *National Defence Act*, or
 - (ii) Employed on duties that the Governor in Council, in regulations made under the *National Defence Act* for the purposes of this paragraph, has prescribed to be of such a kind as to necessitate that the officers and non-commissioned members performing them have the powers of peace officers.

3.2 Scoring Rules

Score Only from Police Sources

The basic source of information for UCR scoring is the police occurrence report. It is important that all categories of crime and traffic incidents occurring within a police jurisdiction be reported so that statistical data published by Statistics Canada is complete, accurate, and factual. Only police departmental records should be used when compiling statistical returns.

Assistance Cases

Police services should only report incidents which occur in their jurisdiction or where they have primary investigative authority. A police service assisting another police service should not report the incident to Statistics Canada. In order to prevent duplicate submissions of the same incident it is encouraged that police services communicate with each other when more than one police service is involved in a particular incident.



Integrated Units

Due to the nature of integrated units it is important that agencies communicate and come to an agreement on which agency will report the incident.

Homicide Survey

A set of detailed Homicide Survey forms (i.e., Incident, Victim, Accused, Police Victim or Correctional Victim forms) will be requested from the police service for every incident of culpable (criminal) homicide reported to the UCR survey. Criminal homicide is defined in the *Criminal Code of Canada*, section 222 and includes 1st degree murder, 2nd degree murder, manslaughter and infanticide.

8000 Series

The 8000 series is reserved for internal codes and municipal by-laws. Statistics Canada **does not** use the 8000 series violations for analytical purposes.



3.3 Definition of an Incident

Definition

An incident is defined as a set of connected events usually constituting a police occurrence report. An incident may involve several victims, several CSCs, and multiple violations of the law. Below are several rules to be considered when entering a UCR incident report.

Traffic Violations

All traffic violations have to be separated from non-traffic violations and should be recorded as separate incidences.

The Continuing Offence Rule

In some cases, several violations are recorded together under what is referred to as the **Continuing Offence Rule**. This means that several violations can be tied together because they either happened in a sequential manner, they repeat over time, or they are all part of a larger case.

In order for the continuing offence rule to apply, enough elements of the crime must be the same for it to be considered one incident.

One violation occurring over a period of time and/or location or two or more violations of the law (and their related victims and CSCs), are grouped into the same unique incident if they are committed by the same person or group of persons, AND:

- i) they are part of simultaneous or sequential actions that occur at the same place (not repeated actions over a long period of time, but actions committed simultaneously or in sequence in a short period of time at the same place), or
- ii) they are part of interrelated actions over a short period of time, that is, actions where one action leads to the other or where one is the consequence of the other(s), or
- iii) when a the same violation is repeated over a period of time and all the violations only come to the attention of the police at one point in time, or
- iv) when a series of similar crimes (such as a series of mischiefs) committed at the same location by the same individual(s), come to the attention of the police at one point in time.

Please note that **conspiracy to commit** and the crime for which the CSC conspired are counted as separate incidents if they occur at different times (before the crime occurred).

The terms governing when one can use the Continuing Offence Rule (and thereby group several violations into one incident) can be complex and sometimes seem contradictory. It is the purpose of this section to try to outline when to use the rule, and to include as many of the most common situations as possible as illustrations.

If linkages are identified over multiple calls for service, either by police or records staff, then the continuing offence rule would apply, with the understanding that some agencies will be able to spend more time/effort at identifying such linkages than others. If the calls come in separately, it may not always be obvious that these incidents happened together. If the police service is in doubt, or there is no clear link, or a link has not been identified, then the police service should file each as a separate incident.

Below is one example where it might get reported in different ways depending on how the calls come in:



Example A).

6 calls come in from 6 complainants within an hour all reporting youth keying cars on the street in front of their house. One officer attends and files all in one report using one UCR incident with a counter for the number of motor vehicles targeted.

Example B).

6 calls come in from 6 complainants over a 24 hour period, each reporting discovering their vehicle had been keyed. The calls come in to different dispatchers and during different shifts. It is not readily apparent to the officers attending that they all occurred together. Each officer files their own report with their own UCR incident.

Both of these examples are correct. The continuing offence rule is meant to be a tool to help minimize the administrative burden of UCR reporting. Statistics Canada uses the counter to inflate incidents, so whether reported as one incident with a counter of 6, or 6 separate incidents, the same number of incidents will be counted.

Here are detailed circumstances under which the Continuing Offence Rule applies:

1) Several violations in a sequential manner

Phillip breaks into a house, while there he confronts the owner and assaults him.

Both of these violations occurred at the same time and place, so would be included on one incident.

Rebecca drives down the street and hits two cars, she leaves the scene of the accident and drives another 5 minutes and hits another car.

All of these incidents occur in a sequence, although they might have happened on different streets (locations), it is generally thought of as one continuous dangerous driving case, and can therefore be included in one incident.

A call comes in with regards to a suspicious vehicle. Police attend and discover a driver who is impaired. In addition, drugs are found in the vehicle. This should be reported as two incidents (traffic and non-traffic are always separated), one for the impaired driving (traffic offence), and one for the possession of drugs.

2) Part of interrelated actions over a short period of time

Chris sets fire to a private house and two occupants die in the blaze.

In this instance, the death of two occupants is a direct consequence of the initial arson. One UCR incident should be reported with two violations (one for arson and one for the death of the two occupants).

Sara is arrested for possession of stolen goods. She is transported to the station where a thorough search finds drugs on her person.

This should be reported as one UCR incident. The drugs should or could have been discovered by police officers at the original scene. A new incident is not required simply because the location of the discovery is different. In addition, reporting two separate incidents would make it look like the possession of narcotics is taking place at the police station.



3) Several violations repeat over time

Arthur is accused of sexually assaulting his daughter. The incest took place over 5 years.

This is reported as one UCR incident as it came to the attention of police at one time. The 'to' and 'from' dates are used to indicate the period of time for which the violation repeatedly occurred.

Kathryn, working at a gas station, has been steadily skimming money out of the till, each week she takes \$10 or \$20 out. The amount is so small the owner does not realize for 8 months.

This repeated violation is one continuous offence and should be reported as one UCR incident. A new incident does not need to be entered – the 'to' and 'from' dates should be used to indicate the period of time which the violation occurred over.

John and Laura are in a tumultuous marriage. Over the last 3 years there have been several incidents where John assaulted Laura, however, police were never contacted. Finally police are contacted and a report is taken.

Since the assault spanned 3 years and all the information came to the attention of police at one time, police can file one incident of assault and use the to and from dates to show how long this has occurred. If, however, police were contacted on multiple occasions, they should report one incident each time they are contacted.

Once the violation is known to police and reported in an incident, should it re-occur, it would now need a new incident, i.e., if a man has repeatedly sexually assaulted his daughter, is charged by police, and a year later is re-arrested for the same offence, an entirely new incident is required.

4) All part of a larger case

Warren commits murder, and sets the building on fire (arson) in order to cover up the murder.

These are both part of the larger murder case, so should be reported in one incident.

Lindsay is selling crystal meth to an undercover agent. Over a 3 day period, the agent buys 5 times from the dealer to make a case.

This can be considered one continuous incident. Most of the elements are the same, and it is a controlled environment, since the police are knowingly allowing the infraction to be committed. However, day to day drug cases and major crime investigations may differ from one another in their use of this rule.

Major Case arrests 4 individuals involved in a series of drug transactions with different clients over different times and locations.

These can NOT be grouped into one offence, since too many of the elements are different.

When should you NOT use the Continuing Offence Rule?

Generally, enough elements of the crime need to be the same to use the Continuing Offence Rule.

Amelia commits a Break and Enter on Elm Street, and then an hour later robs a bank on Crystal Lake Boulevard.

There are too many elements that differ with this example. This should be reported as two separate incidents. Generally, the location should be the same to use the Continuing Offence Rule.



The Mischief Exception to place

Some crimes are of a less serious nature. When several of these come to the attention of police at the same time, they are dealt with as one larger incident.

Jean-Denis keys cars down one street and then up another. Although we understand that vehicles are separate locations, the crime had a unifying theme, and occurred in the street (the cars were not stolen or moved) so for this purpose we see them as all part of one larger incident of Mischief.

Similarly, if someone breaks 5 mailboxes on 5 houses, it is all part of one incident (as long as it became known to police all at once). Similarly to a series of motor vehicles being targeted with Mischief, as long as it is only Mischief and it is believed to have occurred in a sequential manner by police and all came to the attention of police at the same time, you may use this exception.

A good rule is to look at how police will respond and investigate this offence. Will they consider this one general occurrence? How different are the elements of the crime?

Here are some additional scenarios highlighting the **Continuing Offence Rule**:

A call came in for a fight inside a hockey arena, a second call came in with the caller stating some males are outside now. The 3 males that were involved in the fight are now in the parking lot and just slashed the tires of a car in the parking lot. There were a total of 8 vehicles that had their tires slashed. There were 3 males arrested.

One incident can be used with an Assault and one Mischief (with a counter of eight), since the subsequent mischiefs all occurred in a sequential manner. As mentioned above, all the information came to the police at one time, the cars had their tires slashed at the same time.

Call came in as a theft from a department store, a description of the vehicle and direction of travel was given by the caller. An officer attempted to stop this vehicle and it would not stop, speed of 50km/hr increased to 65 km/hr, then increased to 110 - 115 km/hour. Vehicle is eventually stopped with one suspect arrested. We then learn that the vehicle was reported stolen earlier that day and the suspect was on probation.

Although these all occurred in a sequential manner, there are too many different variables for it to be one incident. The Theft of the motor vehicle occurred much earlier and at a different location and time as well as a being a different complainant and violation type. Also note that traffic offences are always reported as a separate incident.

A call came in as a theft from a large shopping mall. There were 2 suspects who had stolen items from stores and left the mall on 3 occasions to hide the articles in the woods. On their third attempt they were arrested for theft under. They stole from 3 different stores, and 3 file numbers were generated for Theft under \$5000.

Since this call involved three different stores (locations) it would be recorded as three separate incidents.

A call came in as a smashed window and an open garage door at a radiator business. The caller didn't go in to see if anyone was still there. Upon arrival, the officer noted that the main window of the business had been completely smashed out and that the door had also been left open. The key holder arrived and it was discovered that 2 vehicles were stolen, 1 vehicle was inside the business, and the other was outside. There was a safe missing containing documents, no cash.



Each motor vehicle is considered a separate place, but because the motor vehicle thefts occurred at the same time and at the same location, they can be recorded on one incident with a counter of two. The Break & Enter would be recorded on a separate incident report.

Cross-Charging

In some situations, like a fight, the CSC may also be a victim. This would require that 2 incident reports are created, one with Person A as the CSC, and another with Person A as the victim. The same person cannot be both the CSC and the victim on 1 incident report.



3.4.1 Violations against the Person (1000 Series violations)

All actions committed against the same victim(s) occurring under the same conditions are grouped together. 1000-series violations are dependent on the actions of the CSC(s) and the link between their different actions and victims.

Two men commit a bank robbery. They assault a customer of the bank during the incident and when outside the bank they shoot and kill a bank guard who was attempting to stop them.

In this incident there are three different violations of the law: a murder, an assault, and a robbery. They are all part of the same incident because they are all interrelated: the murder and the assault are the consequence of the robbery and they would not have occurred without the initial offence. Accordingly, all violations are grouped as one incident.

A bus driver and two passengers are assaulted by two young men.

The three assaults are part of the same incident because they occurred simultaneously at the same place.

A motorcycle driver cuts off a passenger vehicle, the vehicle follows the driver to the next light. At the light a fight ensues resulting in one of the passengers being transported to the hospital, while the other has relatively minor injuries.

Since the assault took place at the same time and place, you would submit one incident record, with one CSC record (the motorcycle driver) and two victim records (the passengers). Each victim record should show their own level of injury (minor and major injuries respectively).

There are certain violent violations which may be perpetrated against the victim multiple times over a given period. It may not be possible to determine the specific number of times these violations were committed. When a violation is committed repeatedly against the same victim(s) by the same CSC(s) and it comes to the attention of police all at the same time, only one incident is recorded. The *to date* and *from date* variables would be used on this incident to indicate the violation(s) took place over a period of time.



3.4.2 Violations against Property (2000 series violations)

Break and Enter

Given the definition of *place* and the nature of Break and Enter, there can only be one violation of Break and Enter on an incident. Therefore, the number of incidents of Break and Enter reported is equal to the number of different places broken into. Note, if a single house, the attached garage, and the backyard shed are broken into, only one Break and Enter is scored because all these structures are located at the same place (as defined above).

Examples

A man breaks into ten separately rented apartments in an apartment building.

Ten incidents of Break and Enter will be reported because each distinct apartment is defined as a separate place.

A house and detached garage on the same contiguous property are broken into.

Only one incident of Break and Enter is reported because the house and detached garage are considered a single place situated on a single piece of property.

Four offices in a building are broken into after closing hours and ransacked. The offices are occupied by: 1) a lawyer, 2) a dentist, 3) a doctor, and 4) a construction firm. They do not share their space and have no business connection.

Four incidents of Break and Enter will be reported to the UCR survey because each office is deemed a distinct and separate place.

A secured locker room in an apartment building is broken into and goods are stolen from ten lockers.

One incident of Break and Enter will be reported because all the actions were committed in sequence over a short period of time at the same place.

Some money is stolen from ten lockers at a swimming pool complex.

One incident of Theft would be reported. Break and Enter is not scored, as the perpetrator committed theft in a publicly accessible location.

A number of apartments are broken into in an apartment building. Three of them were unoccupied, the other two were occupied.

Three incidents of Break and Enter will be reported - two incidents for the two occupied apartments, and one incident for the group of three unoccupied apartments. This is because each 'place' must be separately owned, rented, or occupied (except for motor vehicles).

A woman breaks into a garden shed and steals a bicycle.

Since the violation meets the *Criminal Code* definition of Break and Enter it should be coded as a Break and Enter and not a Theft.

Arson

The number of incidents of arson is determined by the number of different places where a fire was set.

Examples



Two units in an apartment building are set on fire by two separately ignited fires, without the intention of burning the whole building down.

Two incidents of Arson are reported (a fire was set in 2 different places).

A fire is set to one unit in an apartment building and four units burn down.

One incident of Arson (only one fire was set). If a fire is set to a single home and the neighbouring house also burns, there is only one incident of Arson (only one fire was set).

A store and the two apartments on the second floor are destroyed by fire. The investigation concludes that the fire was criminally set at the back of the store using gas.

One incident of Arson would be reported.

A fire is set in a vehicle parked on the street.

One incident of Arson would be reported.

Two fires are set to two houses on the same street.

Two incidents of Arson will be reported because the two fires were set to two different places.

Two fires are set at the back of an apartment building.

Only one incident of Arson will be reported. The fire was not set to individual apartments and the apartment building itself was the target of the CSC.

Several fires are set in a recreational facility by one person.

Only one incident of Arson will be reported as the recreational facility is a single place and the fires were set within the single place.

Possession of Stolen Goods

When the police apprehend a person (or group of persons) who is (are) in possession of stolen goods, this is scored as one incident. The scoring is not dependent on the number of stolen objects, the number of persons who own the objects, the number of CSCs, or the number of places where these objects are stored. Please include the property codes with any incident of Possession of Stolen Goods.

Please note that **Possession** offences can now be entered on the same incident as **Theft** offences.

Please use the following guidelines when deciding whether to include the possession as a part of the original offence or to code to a new incident:

- If police apprehend a suspect during or immediately after a Theft, possession is implied as part of the theft violation. That is to say do not code the **Possession**, just the **Theft**.
- If police apprehend a suspect later and charge the CSC with **Possession**, please create a separate incident for the Possession and a separate incident for the Theft, as it is not clear that the same persons were involved in the Theft as the Possession (possibly another CSC)

Examples

A man is arrested in a parking lot selling stolen watches.

One incident of Possession of Stolen Goods will be reported.



A man is arrested for speeding. The police discover stolen goods in his car. Subsequently, additional stolen goods are discovered in his house and his cottage.

One incident of Possession of Stolen Goods will be reported.

Stolen goods are discovered in a warehouse. The investigation reveals the stolen goods were stored in this place by two men.

One incident of Possession of Stolen Goods would be reported to the survey, and two persons would be charged in relation to this incident.

Joel arrested for Possession of Stolen Goods. He tells police that he bought them from someone else. Police discover more stolen goods in the apartment of the second man.

Two incidents of Possession of Stolen Goods must be recorded, one person is charged for each incident.

Identity theft (theft rules apply)

Identity theft refers to stolen identity information that is gathered but not used.

John goes into Adam's Wallet. He copies down the credit card/debit card info and security code on the back. The information was not used.

A card skimmer is installed at a gas station and comes to the attention of the police. The suspect is arrested when he comes to collect the skimmer.

Identity fraud

Identity fraud refers to stolen identity information that is used.

Greg's wallet is stolen and his credit card/debit card is used to make online purchases.

The UCR survey uses a fraud counter to track the number of fraudulent cheques issued and the number of times a transaction card is used in a fraudulent manner.

One record will be created for each transaction card which is used for fraudulent purposes together with a count of the number of times that it was used. For Fraud by cheque, one record will be created for each location where cheques were passed by the same person or group of persons within a given period and a count of the number of cheques issued at each location will be provided. A 'count' will be generated for the number of fraudulent actions occurring within each type of Fraud.

Fraud

For most other types of Frauds (**i.e.** excluding cheques or transaction cards), one record will be created each time a fraudulent action is committed. One record will be created when a number of similar fraudulent actions occur at one time in one location, using the counter to indicate the number of frauds that occurred.

A man enters a store and knowingly issues three bad cheques and subsequently enters a second store and knowingly issues two additional bad cheques

Two incidents of Fraud will be reported to UCR 2* with the counter indicating three for the first incident and two fraudulent actions, thus showing the number of cheques passed within each store.



A woman enters a shopping centre and uses a stolen credit card/debit card in three different stores.

One incident of Fraud will be reported to the survey with the counter indicating three fraudulent actions.

A health/fitness club sells lifetime memberships to two hundred customers at one location (place). The club never opens.

One incident of Fraud will be reported with the counter indicating two hundred fraudulent actions, thus showing the number of times a similar fraudulent action had occurred at one time and one location.

Theft and Mischief

Motor Vehicles

Each Motor Vehicle Theft violation will be recorded as a separate incident, unless the vehicles were stolen from the same location at the same time. In this case, one incident of Motor Vehicle Theft will be recorded, with a counter showing the number of vehicles stolen.

NOTE: incidents which allow motor vehicle as a stolen property AND a counter can have more than one type of motor vehicle as stolen property on the record.

Examples

Four men working as a gang steal three cars in a parking lot.

One Incident of Theft of a Motor Vehicle would be reported with a counter of 000003.

Five vehicles are damaged by spray paint on a residential street.

One incident of Mischief would be reported with a counter of 000005.

Two vehicles are stolen from a private driveway.

If the vehicles were stolen at the same time and same place, they can be reported on one incident regardless of whether the location is a car dealership, a parking lot or a home. If the parking space had been somehow enclosed, **i.e.**, fenced-in parking lot, a Break and Enter violation must also be included as part of the incident, as per the *Criminal Code*.

Theft or Mischief

The definition of an incident for this category of violations is not based on the number of objects stolen or the number of CSCs. It is dependent on whether or not the CSCs are acting together, and on whether or not the thefts or mischief are committed simultaneously or sequentially at the same place.

Examples

Two men go into a coatroom and steal from ten coats.

One incident of Theft is scored as the action takes place simultaneously at the same place and the two men act together.

Two bicycles are stolen from the backyard of private property.

One incident of Theft will be reported.

A woman enters a shopping centre and shoplifts in five stores.



Five incidents of Theft will be reported as the thefts were committed at five different places.

A student steals from seven lockers where he attends school.

One incident of Theft will be reported.

Two individuals go to a mall - they split up and both shoplift.

They are not acting together so two incidents will be reported.

Theft from Mail

Since breaking into a mailbox does not meet the essential elements of Break & Enter, only include the Break and Enter violation where there is evidence that a break-in occurred into a mail-room or into another place to obtain the mail.

If mail is stolen and the mailbox is damaged in the process, you may consider adding the Mischief violation to the incident.

If there is evidence of a Break and Enter as part of this incident please include this on the UCR record. For example, if a home was broken into and mail was stolen.



3.4.3 Incidents Comprising Many Violations of the Law

A single incident can group together violations of a different nature (**e.g.**, violations against the person, property violations, **etc.**). For example:

A man breaks into a house to steal, but he is caught in the act by the owner. He assaults the owner and runs away.

The property violation (Break and Enter), and the violation against the person (Assault) are of a different nature, but they are grouped together because they are interrelated - they were committed by the same person at the same place and occurred in close chronological order.

In some cases violations come to the attention of the police while they are investigating an unrelated matter - for example:

A man is arrested by the police because he is driving a stolen car. While being detained and searched at the scene, the man is found to be in possession of cocaine.

Due to the violations coming to the attention of the police at the same time during the same occurrence, they can be grouped together and reported on the UCR survey as one incident.

3.5 Definitions of Founded and Unfounded Incidents

Potential impact of improved reporting standards

At its inception in 1962, the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Survey collected information on both founded and unfounded criminal incidents. Counts of unfounded incidents were collected to measure the proportion of all incidents reported to the police where it was “determined through police investigation that the offence reported did not occur, nor was it attempted.” Over time, however, the use of unfounded data declined due to data quality issues and publication was suspended in 2006. In 2018, after working with police to improve reporting of these data, Statistics Canada resumed publishing unfounded incidents.

As part of reinstating the collection of information on unfounded incidents, the definition of both founded and unfounded criminal incidents was updated in January 2018 to reflect a more victim-centred approach. The category of unsubstantiated was removed as an option at this time.

Founded:

An incident is founded if, after police investigation it has been determined that the reported offence did occur or was attempted (even if the charged/suspect chargeable (CSC) [i.e., the accused] is unknown) or there is no credible evidence to confirm that the reported incident did not take place. This includes third-party reports that fit these criteria.

Unfounded:

An incident is unfounded if it has been determined through police investigation that there was sufficient evidence to show that the offence reported did not occur, nor was it attempted.

Effective January 1, 2018.

The following are the only reporting requirements for unfounded incidents:

1. Valid respondent code (RESPCODE)
2. Valid incident file number (INCFLNUM)
3. Valid report date (RPRTDATE)
4. Valid update status (IUPDSTAT)
5. No csc record allowed
6. Valid viol1

Street Gang: Defined as a more or less structured group of adolescents, young adults, and/or adults who use intimidation and violence to commit criminal acts on a regular basis, in order to obtain power and recognition and/or control specific areas of criminal activities. Any two of the following criteria must be met when classifying an individual as a 'street gang member':

- 1) the person displays gang identification marks, has performed initiation rituals or possesses gang paraphernalia (tattoos, weapons **etc.**)
- 2) information from a reliable source (**i.e.**, inside gang member or rival gang member, community resource, school authority, member of the business community, citizen) that the person associates with known gang members
- 3) a police surveillance report confirming that the person associates with known gang members
- 4) an admission from the person of gang membership
- 5) Judicial finding that confirms the person's membership in the gang.

Respondents would continue to use the UCR violation codes (e.g., extortion, homicide, drug violations), and, in addition would flag whether or not the incident was committed by a criminal organization or street gang.

All incidents identified by organized crime or street gang intelligence units as being committed by criminal organizations/ street gangs should be forwarded to the central records unit to ensure that the incident is captured.

If Luring a Child via Computer (1370) or Agreement or Arrangement – Sexual Offence Against a Child (1371) is an incident violation (VIOL1-4) then the Cybercrime Indicator (CYBCRIND) must be Yes (01) and the Cybercrime Type must be Instrument (02). Cybercrime classification (CYBCRCLS) is normally Exploitation, Harassment, or Abuse of a Person (08) in this circumstance, but others may apply.

If the Fraud Type (FRAUDTYP) is Computer (60) then the Cybercrime Indicator (CYBCRIND) must be Yes (01). Cybercrime classification (CYBCRCLS) is normally Fraud (06) in this circumstance, but others may apply.

Where a computer or the internet was used for disabling other computers or defacing websites, do not code both target and instrument. In these cases, score the computer/internet as the target of the crime.

<p>In order to properly identify and code hate crime incidents, consulted investigators have identified the importance of considering the surrounding circumstances. These may include (but are not limited to):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - what was said - timing of any slur - history between parties - level of threat displayed - when applicable, the severity and context of violence, vandalism, and/or destruction of property, <u>i.e.</u>, how an object was vandalized - absence of any other information - was a victim 'randomly' targeted? - perceptions of the victim - visibility of the victim - only person of that characteristic in neighborhood? - other similar people/groups targeted - is the person visibly different? Are they 'out' if LGBT? - community context/neighbourhood - race/ethnicity/sexual orientation of suspect - all surrounding and supporting evidence. 	



Other guidelines for determining if an incident should be coded as a hate crime:

- 1) The crime is directed at a community. To be considered a hate crime, the incident does not have to be directed at an individual. For example, in R. v. Simms (1990) the court has upheld that hate-symbols such as swastikas should be counted as hate crimes because of their impact on communities. To say that perpetrators are not aware that their actions may offend or be interpreted as hateful is not really credible. To this end we can interpret actions to reflect motive. The Swastika is an international hate symbol and using it can be interpreted to mean there is hatred behind the displaying of the symbol. This holds true for other hate graffiti as well. If an accused spray paints a statement calling for harm to certain races or ethnicities and the police later arrest the person and the person claims it was only a joke, the police should still count the incident as an incident of hate-motivated graffiti.

We do not have to have an actual victim to report a hate crime. If someone spray paints a swastika on a bridge, we still consider this as a hate-motivated mischief, even if the bridge does not belong to a particular individual. Victimization is projected to all community members. There is a sense of group vulnerability, and possible community fear, tension & polarization.

- 2) Statistics Canada would like to record all incidents of hate-motivated crime whether or not an accused has been identified. The perpetrator's actions and/or words may demonstrate that their reason for committing the crime was based on hatred for an identifiable group.
- 3) The victim need not be a member of that group for the incident to apply. Therefore, the characteristic of the incident and the characteristic of the victim may not match. Examples include if someone carves a swastika into the door on a catholic woman's home, this is still considered an anti-Jewish incident or if a straight man is attacked and called anti-gay names while being beaten, this is still considered an anti-gay incident. We look at the characteristics of the offence not the victim.
- 4) Any other similar factor includes factors not innumerate specifically in section 718.2 of the Criminal Code, but for which the police service believes that the individual was targeted with hatred because of an identifiable characteristic. This could include, for example, hatred of the victim's profession, political ideology, or their socio-economic status (e.g. individuals who are homeless).
- 5) There must be evidence to support that this specific incident was motivated by hate and not simply opportunity.

If Hate-motivated mischief relating to property used by identifiable group (2176), Advocating Genocide (3550) or Public Incitement of Hatred (3560) is an incident violation (VIOL1-4), then the Hate Crime Indicator (HATCRIND) must be Yes (01).

Respondents should score incidents using appropriate UCR violation codes (e.g., assault, criminal harassment, vandalism), and, in addition, flag whether or not the incident was motivated by hate. The perpetrator's actions and/or words may demonstrate that their reason for committing the crime was based on hatred for an identifiable group.

All incidents scored as Yes or Suspected must be confirmed by the appropriate specialized unit or individual responsible for hate crime within the police service (where applicable).

If, after an incident has been submitted to the CCJCSS, further information reveals that the incident was motivated by hate, the original file should be updated to reflect this.

If the Hate Crime Indicator (HATCRIND) is Yes (01) or Suspected (02) then the Hate Crime Type (HATCRTYP) cannot be Not Applicable (99) and the Hate Crime Motivation (HATCRMOT) cannot be Not Applicable (99).

If more than two motivations are applicable and integral to the incident then code Hate Crime Type (HATCRTYP) to Combination (More than two factors) (09) and Hate Crime Motivation (HATCRMOT) to Combination (More than two factors) (76). Hate Crime Type 2 (HATCRTY2) must be Not Applicable (99) and Hate Crime Motivation 2 (HATCRMO2) must be Not Applicable (99) in these instances (ex: a white supremacist group known to target more than two groups partaking in a march, or graffiti of the group's symbol).

Sexual Orientation should be chosen as a category with respect to who a person is attracted to. Sex/gender should be chosen as a category for how a person self identifies (example: gay is a sexual orientation category, transgendered is a sex/gender category). The two categories are not exclusive in that it's possible to be both transgender and gay.

Standard Definitions

Crime Gun

A crime gun is any of the following:

- a) A firearm (as defined under the *Criminal Code*) used, or suspected to be used in the commission of a criminal offence, regardless of whether or not it was possessed legally;
- b) or a firearm that has an obliterated, altered or removed serial number.

Included in Crime Gun:

- Both incidents where a firearm has a serial number altered or obliterated as well as a firearm used in criminal activity will be included.
- Replicas, toys, 3D printed firearms should all be included, as should pellet or BB guns / air guns but ONLY when they are used in a threatening, intimidating or criminal manner. To address this, the proposed definition includes wording which focuses on the police investigation substantiating that the weapon was used in a criminal manner. This will allow police to include weapons they believe should be included (threats, intimidation, violence), while excluding toys used in routine play

Not included in Crime Gun:

- Guns deemed to be illegal because of a regulatory requirement will not be included. For example, an owner who let their Possession and Acquisition Licence (PAL) expire. To address concern, the proposed definition does not include regulatory or administrative offences in the crime gun category, and use language such as criminal offence to be specific.
- Replicas, toys, 3D printed firearms will not be included, nor pellet or BB guns / air guns if they are not used in a threatening, intimidating or criminal manner. To address this, the proposed definition includes wording which focuses on the police investigation substantiating that the weapon was used in a criminal manner. This will allow police to include weapons they believe should be included (threats, intimidation, violence), while excluding toys used in routine play

Police will determine whether or not a firearm should be classified as a crime gun as a result of the investigation.

Shooting

A shooting includes criminal incidents where the victim(s) or property was reported to have been shot or shot at with a firearm (firearm as defined under the *Criminal Code* of Canada) and refers to any incident where the investigation supported that credible physical or witness testimony existed that one or more projectiles were discharged from a firearm.

This definition would include:

- a) An incident where a person fires a firearm with intent at a victim and causes death or injury to one or more persons.
- b) An incident where a person fires a firearm with intent at a victim and does not cause injury or death to one or more persons.



- c) An incident where a person intentionally discharges a firearm into or at a place, knowing that or being reckless as to whether another person is present in the place; or who intentionally discharges a firearm while being reckless as to the life or safety of another person.

This definition would exclude:

- d) A report of shots fired where there is no evidence to support the report.
- e) Incidents of suicide and attempted suicide by firearm
- f) Incidents of killing an animal by firearm (hunting, lawfully putting down an animal, but does not include criminal killing of an animal)
- g) Incidents where a peace officer discharges a firearm lawfully (does not involve criminal discharge of a firearm by a peace officer)

Possession of stolen vehicle (VA, VC, VL, VM, VO or VT or ED, EM and VB if considered to be motor vehicles) must be on a separate incident.

Identity Information:

SECTION 7: 3000, 4000 and 6000 SERIES

7.1 – Other *Criminal Code* (3000 series)

These violations are made up of *Criminal Code* violations that do not involve crimes against the person (1000 series), crimes against property (2000 series), CDSA and *Cannabis Act* (4000 series) or traffic violations (9000 series). Non-violent weapons offences, gaming and betting and child pornography are included in the list of offences, which can be found in Section 9.



7.2 – Controlled Drug and Substances Act (CDSA) Violations and Cannabis Act Violations (4000 series)

The violations in the CDSA are recorded on the UCR survey using 4000 series violation codes. These codes along with their maximum penalties are listed on the Violation Reference Chart (Section 9). For a complete listing of the relevant CDSA sections, *Cannabis Act* sections and their related UCR violation codes, see the Concordance Table in Section 10. There are no specific requirements or restrictions for the entry of 4000 series violation codes.

7.3 – Other Federal Statutes (6000 Series)

The 6000 series codes include violations of other Federal Statutes. Codes in this series include the *Quarantine Act* (6600), the *Canada Health Act* (6250), the *Youth Criminal Justice Act* (6450), the *Immigration & Refugee Protection Act* (6500), among others. Where a Federal Statute is not specified with a particular UCR violation code it is captured under the category of Other Federal Statutes (6900).

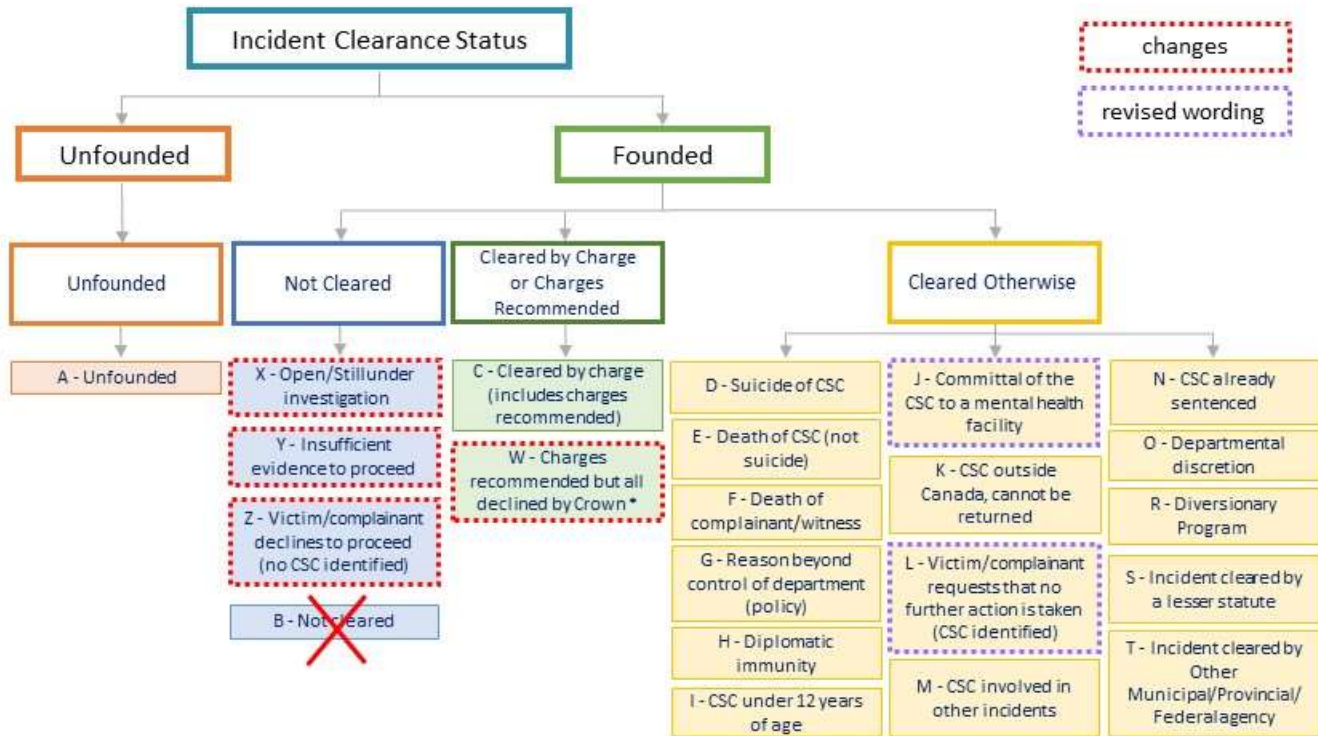

Incident Clearance Status Chart

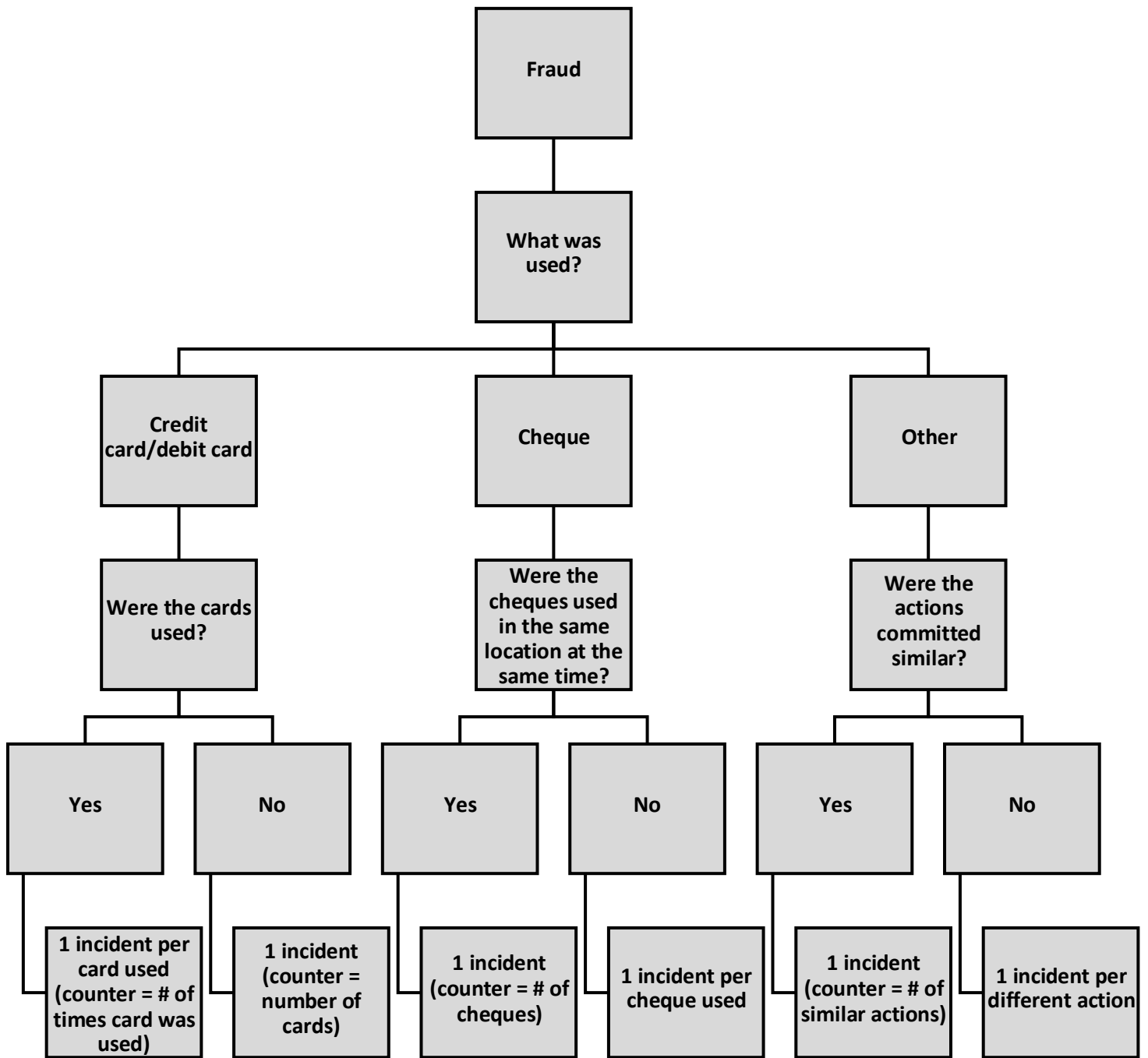
UCR Incident Clearance Status Options as decided by POLIS
